Quota places for both teams and individuals are allocated to the NOC.

C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions), as well as the IOC Policy on the Protection of the Female (Women's) Category in Olympic Sport and Guiding Considerations for International Federations and Sports Governing Bodies (the "Policy").

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the Policy, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, the conditions of participation established by the IOC, as well as the rules or policies of the FEI, may participate in the LA28 Olympic Games.

Age Requirements

- C.1.** To be eligible to participate in the Olympic Games Los Angeles 2028, athletes must have been born on or before 31 December 2010 (no younger than 18 years of age in the year that the Olympic Games take place), as validated by the passport used for ACR registration.

All horses participating in the Olympic Games Los Angeles 2028 must have been born on or before 31 December 2019 (no younger than nine years of age in the year that the Olympic Games take place).

Additional IF Requirements

- C.2.** Athletes must also comply with the Minimum Eligibility Requirements criteria.

1. Minimum Eligibility Requirements

All athletes/horses that take part in the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic Games Eventing Competitions, and subject to the provisions of paragraphs 2 (List of Selected Events) and 3 (Participation Restriction) below, must achieve the following Minimum Eligibility Requirements (MERs) as a combination by obtaining "FEI MER Results" in the following level of competitions which will take place from 1 January 2027 until (and including) 11 June 2028:

- (i) One (1) FEI MER Result at a CCI5*-L; or
- (ii) One (1) FEI MER Result in a CCI4*-L AND 1 FEI MER Result in a CCI4*-S

Should the above result(s) be obtained in 2027, one additional FEI MER result in a CCI4*-S or CCI4*-L or CCI5*-L must be obtained after 1 January 2028 and on or before 11 June 2028 (the "Confirmation Result").

For combinations submitting multiple FEI MER/Confirmation Results, these must be achieved at a minimum of two different venues.

An FEI MER Result/Confirmation Result is achieved by completing the above competitions within the minimum parameters of an all-round performance, with:

- (i) Dressage test: Not less than 55 per cent. Dressage good marks (no more than 45 penalty points);

- (ii) Cross Country test: clear (0) round or 9, or 11 penalty points on Cross Country Obstacles, not more than 75 seconds over the optimum Cross Country phase time. At CCI5*-L, the maximum time by which the optimum time may be exceeded is 100 seconds;
- (iii) Jumping Test: Not more than 16 jumping penalties.

To participate in the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic Games, a horse must not be reverse qualified, as detailed in Article 522 of the FEI Eventing Rules, either at the time of the Nominated Entries or at the time of the Los Angeles 2028 Sport Entries deadline.

Minimum participation: To be eligible as Olympic qualification events, team competitions must include at least three NOCs, i.e. with teams presented at the 1st Horse Inspection. At least three athletes of the team must complete the relevant Olympic qualification event for the respective NOC to be eligible to receive a team quota place.

2. List of Selected Events

The lists of Olympic Ranking and MER Events (as defined in the Appendix) that count towards achieving Olympic Ranking Points for 2027 and the FEI MER Result(s)/Confirmation Result for 2027 and 2028 will be published on the FEI website: <https://inside.fei.org>.

- The list of 2027 Olympic Ranking and MER Events will be published on 15 December 2026.
- The list of 2028 MER Events will be published on 15 December 2027.

All CCI4*-S, CCI4*-L, and CCI5*-L Olympic Ranking and MER Events must be held at well-established, experienced venues, as determined by the FEI Eventing Committee. In addition, one higher level event (i.e. CCI(O)4*-S level, CCI(O)4*-L level) or CCI5*-L level) must have been organised at the venue by the same Organising Committee in the year prior to the Olympic Ranking and/or MER Event. Special cases, such as cancellations of past events due to weather conditions, force majeure or other exceptional circumstances, will be reviewed by the Eventing Committee.

No additions of events will be accepted after publication of the selected events calendar. Replacement following cancellation of an event for force majeure reasons will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

A minimum of one FEI Eventing L4 Official must be appointed at each Olympic Ranking and/or MER Event (Ground Jury, Technical Delegate or Course Designer). In addition, the FEI reserves the right to appoint the main officials (Ground Jury (including President), Technical Delegate and Veterinary Delegate) for CCI4*-S, CCI4*-L, and CCI5*-L events that count towards Olympic qualification, Olympic Rankings and Olympic MERs.

3. Participation restriction

No athlete/horse combination may start the Cross-Country test of an event to obtain an Olympic MER/Confirmation Result and/or Olympic Ranking Points within the period of 24 days after having started the Cross-country test of a CCI4*-L and/or CCI5*-L Event and/or 10 days after having started the Cross-country test of a CCI4*-S Event. It is the responsibility of the athlete and their NF to ensure compliance with this requirement.

D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

For the avoidance of doubt, the eligibility of an NOC that has obtained a team or individual quota place (as per the Qualification Pathway below) to be allocated a team/individual quota place and to participate in the LA2028 Olympic Games is subject to compliance with all eligibility requirements as set out in this Qualification System and the FEI Olympic Regulations.

Team Qualification

Sixteen NOCs will obtain team qualification; one as a host country place, with 14 team quota places allocated through FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Events and one through the FEI Eventing Nations Cup™ 2027, as per the table below. See Appendix 2 for the FEI Olympic Groups.

In the event of cancellation of an FEI Olympic Group Qualification Event which cannot be postponed / rescheduled, with such cancellation, postponement or rescheduling subject to the prior approval of the FEI, the team quota places designated for allocation at the cancelled FEI Olympic Group Qualification Event will be allocated to the highest placed Composite Teams within the relevant FEI Olympic Group(s) (not already qualified in accordance with the qualification pathway set out in the below table) as at 31 December 2027. A team consists of three athlete/horse combinations.

1 team (max. 3 athletes)	The host country - Please refer to section D.2. Host country places for further information.
7 teams (max. 21 athletes)	The seven highest ranked teams from the 2026 FEI Eventing World Championships, Aachen, GER (12 – 16 August 2026) excluding the host country team.
2 teams (max. 6 athletes)	The two highest ranked teams from the 2027 European Eventing Championship, Avenches, SUI (14 – 19 September 2027) from FEI Olympic Groups A and/or B, excluding teams already qualified in accordance with the qualification pathway set out in this table.
1 team (max. 3 athletes)	The highest ranked team from Group C 2027 FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Event (TBC 2027), excluding teams already qualified in accordance with the qualification pathway set out in this table.
2 teams (max. 6 athletes)	The two highest ranked teams from FEI Olympic Groups D and/or E at the 2027 Pan-American Games, Lima, PER (TBC 2027), excluding teams already qualified in accordance with the qualification pathway set out in this table.

Individual Qualification

Only NOCs that have not accepted a team quota place are eligible to obtain individual quota places. Each athlete can obtain a maximum of one individual quota place for that athlete's NOC. For Eventing, a nation can qualify for a maximum of two individual places.

The FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing

The FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing (as defined in the Appendix) is limited to the best four results per athlete/horse combination in these events, within the period from 1 January to 31 December 2027. The points system, including the list of events, to be used for establishing the FEI Olympic Ranking - Eventing will be published on 15 December 2026.

D.2.	Host Country Places The host country will be allocated one team quota place with a maximum of three athletes. Each athlete and horse must fulfil the minimum age requirements and the MER to compete. If the host country is unable to field a team, it may send one or two eligible individual athletes instead.	

E. CONFIRMATION

E.1. Confirmation of quota places

After each qualification event, the FEI will publish the results on its website (<https://inside.fei.org>).

The team and individual quota places will be confirmed separately as detailed in paragraph **H. Qualification Timeline**.

By 12 January 2028, further to receipt of the NOC Certificate of Capability from the relevant NOCs by 10 January 2028, the FEI will inform the respective NOCs/NFs in writing of their allocated team quota places. Each NOC/NF must confirm or decline the allocated team quota place by 20 January 2028.

After the NOCs/NFs' confirmation of team participation and reallocation of withdrawn team quota places (if applicable), the FEI will inform the respective NOCs/NFs in writing of their allocated individual quota places on 1 February 2028. Each NOC with individuals must confirm the use of its quota places by 8 February 2028, as detailed in paragraph **H. Qualification Timeline**.

E.2. Confirmation of Host Country Places

The host country must provide its NOC Certificate of Capability by 10 January 2028 and confirm in writing to the FEI the use of its host country places by 12 January 2028.

F. REALLOCATION

F.1. Reallocation of unused Quota Places

1. Unused Team quota places (excluding Host Country places)

- 1.1 If an NOC does not confirm the NOC Certificate of Capability (as defined in the Appendix) by 10 January 2028, or informs the FEI by 20 January 2028 that it is declining its team quota place, the team quota place(s) will be considered to be withdrawn and will be reallocated as follows:
- The team quota place(s) will be redistributed to the Composite Team(s) (as defined in paragraph 1.4 below (and the Appendix)), provided that the NOC(s) had the minimum three eligible combinations as of 31 December 2027. The NOC(s) of the Composite Team(s) will have a period of one week to confirm to the FEI that they will accept the quota place. If the NOC does not confirm the quota place, paragraph 1.2 below applies.
 - If an NOC has declined a team quota place by 20 January 2028 or an NOC has not confirmed the NOC Certificate of Capability by 10 January 2028, then the NOC will not be automatically entitled to be allocated an individual quota place but will remain eligible to obtain one or two individual quota place(s) through the FEI Eventing Olympic Rankings as per the method set out in D.1 above.

For the purpose of this process, the term “withdrawal”/”withdraw” shall mean either:

- (i) A written notification by an NOC to the FEI that the NOC declines its team quota place, or
- (ii) If an NOC does not confirm its NOC Certificate of Capability by the 10 January 2028 deadline.

- 1.2 If an NOC withdraws its team quota place after 20 January 2028 or does not submit a valid FEI Certificate of Capability by 12 June 2028, the following will apply:
- (i) Where an NOC withdraws its team quota place after 20 January 2028 but on/before 11 June 2028:
 - (a) The team quota place(s) will be redistributed as a Composite Team(s) quota place to the NOC of the next highest ranked Composite Team not already qualified, provided that the NOC(s) had the minimum three eligible combinations as of 31 December 2027. That NOC will have a period of one week or until 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) to confirm to the FEI that it will accept the quota place. The NOC must submit the FEI Certificate of Capability to the FEI by 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028.
 - (b) If a NOC that is reallocated a quota place as per paragraph 1.2 (i) (a) above declines the quota place or does not confirm it by the applicable deadline (as set out above), the team quota place(s) will be further redistributed as (a) Composite Team(s) quota place(s) to the NOC of the next highest ranked Composite Team not already qualified, provided that the NOC(s) had the minimum three eligible combinations as of 31 December 2027. That NOC will have a period of one week or until 12 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) to confirm to the FEI that it will accept the quota place. The NOC must submit the FEI Certificate of Capability to the FEI by 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028. If that NOC declines the quota place or does not confirm it by the applicable deadline (as set out above), no further reallocation to Composite Teams will take place, and paragraph 1.3 below will apply.
 - (ii) Where an NOC that has been (re)allocated a team quota place does not or cannot submit a valid FEI Certificate of Capability by 12 June 2028, paragraph 1.3 below will apply.
- 1.3 If the full quota of 16 teams has not been reached following the reallocation of team quota places as detailed above, the unused athlete quota places (three per team) will be reallocated as individual quota places. These places will be allocated to the NOC(s) of the next highest ranked athletes from the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing, excluding NOCs that have already accepted a team quota place or two individual quota places, and provided that the NOC has at least one athlete/horse combination that fulfils the MERs by the MER Deadline of 11 June 2028; or in the case of a NOC that would be receiving its second individual quota place, provided that the NOC has at least two athlete/horse combinations that fulfil the MERs by the MER Deadline of 11 June 2028. The NOCs must each submit an FEI Certificate of Capability no later than one week after being informed of the allocation of the quota place or before 25 June 2028 (whichever is earlier), provided that all athlete/horse combinations on the FEI Certificate of Capability had achieved the MERs by the MER Deadline of 11 June 2028 (23:59, Lausanne time)
- 1.4 Composite Teams (defined below and in the Appendix): A three-member team from an NOC. The Composite Team will be selected through the following process:
- (i) the respective ranking points of each NOC's top three different athletes in the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing will be added together to give the cumulative ranking points;
 - (ii) the NOC with the highest cumulative ranking points will be awarded the redistributed quota place;
 - (iii) in the event of a tie (i.e. where the cumulative ranking points are the same), the redistributed quota place will be awarded to the NOC with the highest ranked athlete on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing. In the event of a further tie, the redistributed quota place will be awarded to the NOC with the second highest ranked athlete on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing, and so on. If the tie cannot be broken by following this process, the FEI will invite the NOCs/NFs concerned to a draw.

2. Unused individual quota place

2.1 If an allocated individual quota place is not confirmed by the NOC or is declined by the NOC on/before the confirmation deadline, 8 February 2028, or an NOC that has been allocated an individual quota place declines its individual quota place on/after 8 February 2028 but before 11 June 2028, the quota place will be reallocated as follows:

- (i) To the NOC of the next highest ranked athlete in the relevant FEI Olympic Group of the FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing in accordance with the qualification procedure. If the quota place to be reallocated was originally allocated based on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing, the quota place will be reallocated to the NOC of the next highest ranked athlete on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing. The NOC that is reallocated a quota place will have a period of one week or until 12 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) to confirm to the FEI that it will accept the quota place. The NOC must submit the FEI Certificate of Capability to the FEI by 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028.
- (ii) If the NOC that is reallocated a quota place as per paragraph 2.1 above declines the quota place or does not confirm it by the applicable deadline (as set out above), the quota place will be further redistributed through the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing.

2.2 If there are any unused or unallocated individual quota places after 12 June 2028, these will be reallocated to the NOC of the next highest ranked athlete(s) from the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The relevant NOC(s) must have at least one athlete/horse combination that fulfilled the MERs by the MER Deadline; or in the case of an NOC that would be receiving its second individual quota place, the relevant NOC must have at least two athlete/horse combinations that fulfil the MERs by the MER Deadline; and
- (ii) the NOC must submit an FEI Certificate of Capability no later than one week after being informed of the allocation of the quota place or before 25 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) provided that all athlete/horse combinations on the FEI Certificate of Capability had achieved the MERs by the MER Deadline of 11 June 2028.

2.3. No reallocations will be made by the FEI after the LA 2028 Sport Entries deadline (26 June 2028) has passed.

F.2. Reallocation of unused Host Country Places

Unused host country place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest-ranked eligible athlete in the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing who is not yet qualified for the Olympic Games, respecting the maximum quota per NOC.

G. AP ALTERNATE ATHLETES

Definition:

Ap athletes are non-competing athletes accredited in the “Ap” category who have different entitlements to competing athletes (accredited as “Aa”) as described in the “Ap” accreditation quotas and conditions outlined in the IOC ACR Annex 1 - Accreditation at the Olympic Games. These alternate athletes are not part of the athlete quota as described in paragraph B. Quota Places. “Ap” alternate athletes could become competing athletes only under the conditions outlined in the IOC/Los Angeles 2028 Late Athlete Replacement policy.

Only NOCs that have qualified a team are entitled to Ap athletes (one athlete and one reserve horse per team) as described in the qualification system.

Eligibility:

“Ap” athletes and reserve horses must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes, as described in paragraph C. Athlete Eligibility.

APPENDIX – Definitions

Composite Team: A three- member team from an NOC. The Composite Team will be selected through the following process:

- the respective ranking points of each NOC's top three different athletes in the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing will be added together to give the cumulative ranking points;
- the NOC with the highest cumulative ranking points will be awarded the redistributed quota place;
- in the event of a tie (i.e. where the cumulative ranking points are the same), the redistributed quota place will be awarded to the NOC with the highest ranked athlete on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing. In the event of a further tie, the redistributed quota place will be awarded to the NOC with the second highest ranked athlete on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking - Eventing, and so on. If the tie cannot be broken following this process, the FEI will invite the NOCs/NFs concerned to a draw.

FEI Certificate of Capability: A certificate that must be provided to the FEI by the National Federation for each athlete and horse that are nominated to participate in the Olympic Games. This certificate confirms the MERs as laid down in the FEI Regulations for Equestrian Events at the Olympic Games. It confirms that the athletes and the horses have the necessary experience and ability to participate at the required standard.

FEI Olympic Groups: means the Olympic Groups as set out in Appendix 2

FEI Olympic Ranking – Eventing: The official rankings based on results achieved by an athlete and horse as a combination at the Olympic Ranking Events during the period from 1 January to 31 December 2027. The List of the Olympic Ranking Events and the relevant ranking rules will be published on 15 December 2026.

FEI Olympic Group Qualification Events: The events at which teams from specific FEI Olympic Groups can participate in order to earn a team quota place, namely:

- For FEI Olympic Groups A and B: the 2027 FEI Eventing European Championships;
- For FEI Olympic Group C: the 2027 Group C FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Event;
- For FEI Olympic Groups D and E: the 2027 Pan-American Games;
- For FEI Olympic Groups F and G: the 2027 Groups F and G FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Event.

MER Deadline: 11 June 2028

MER Events: The events at which athletes and horses can achieve the MERs.

NOC Certificate of Capability: NOC confirmation that at least three athlete/horse combinations from that NOC have achieved the MERs during the FEI Eventing World Championships 2026 – 31 December 2027 period. Such confirmation must be provided to the FEI by 10 January 2028.

Olympic Ranking Events: The events at which points for the FEI Olympic Rankings – Eventing can be earned.
