Quota places for both teams and individuals are allocated to the NOC.

C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions), as well as the IOC Policy on the Protection of the Female (Women's) Category in Olympic Sport and Guiding Considerations for International Federations and Sports Governing Bodies (the "Policy").

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the Policy, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, the conditions of participation established by the IOC, as well as the rules or policies of the FEI, may participate in the LA28 Olympic Games.

Age Requirements

- C.1.** To be eligible to participate in the Olympic Games Los Angeles 2028, athletes must have been born on or before 31 December 2012 (no younger than 16 years of age in the year that the Olympic Games take place), with this validated by the passport used for ACR registration.

All horses participating in the Olympic Games Los Angeles 2028 must have been born on or before 31 December 2020 (no younger than eight years of age in the year that the Olympic Games take place).

Additional IF Requirements

- C.2.** Athletes must also comply with the Minimum Eligibility Requirements criteria.

1. Minimum Eligibility Requirements – Dressage

To be eligible to participate in the Olympic Games Los Angeles 2028 dressage competitions, and subject to the provisions of paragraph 2 below, all athletes/horses must achieve, as a combination, the Minimum Eligibility Requirements (**MER**) at selected events which take place from 1 January 2027 until (and including) 11 June 2028 (the "**MER Deadline**"). Athlete/horse combinations must fulfil the MER as described below.

A minimum 67 per cent must be awarded twice to the athlete/horse combination by both an L4 judge and as an average by all judges in the competition, and the score must be achieved in a Grand Prix test at two different CDI3*/CDI4*/CDI5*/CDI-W/CDIO events. The two L4 judges must be of a nationality other than of the athlete. Scores achieved in Grand Prix Consolation classes judged by three judges do not count towards the MER.

Athletes and horses must achieve the MER at events which take place from 1 January 2027 until the MER Deadline of 11 June.

2. List of Selected Events

The list of Olympic Ranking Events and MER Events (as defined in the Appendix) for achieving Olympic ranking points/the MER will be published on the FEI website: www.fei.org. The list of Olympic Ranking Events and 2027 MER events will be published on 15 December 2026, and the 2028 MER events will be published on 15 December 2027 at the latest. No additional events will be accepted after publication of the selected events calendar. Replacements in the event of cancellation of an event for *force majeure* reasons will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

For the avoidance of doubt, the eligibility of an NOC that has obtained a team or individual quota place (as per the Qualification Pathway below) to be allocated a team/individual quota place and to participate in the LA2028 Olympic Games is subject to compliance with all eligibility requirements as set out in this Qualification System and the FEI Olympic Regulations.

Team Qualification

Fifteen NOCs will obtain team qualification, one as a host country place and 14 with team quota places allocated through FEI Olympic Group Qualification Events. A team consists of three athlete/horse combinations.

In the event of cancellation of an FEI Olympic Group Qualification Event which cannot be postponed/rescheduled, with such cancellation, postponement or rescheduling subject to the prior approval of the FEI, the team quota places designated for allocation at the cancelled FEI Olympic Group Qualification Event will be allocated to the highest placed Composite Teams within the relevant FEI Olympic Group(s) (not already qualified in accordance with the qualification pathway set out in the below table) as of 31 December 2027.

The highest ranked team from Olympic Group G at the 2026 FEI Dressage World Championships, Aachen, GER (11 – 23 August 2026), excluding a team already qualified in accordance with the qualification pathway set out in this table.

If the quota place is not filled at the 2026 FEI Dressage World Championships, the quota place will be allocated to the highest ranked team from Olympic Group G at a 2027 Group G FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Event (dates and location TBD if applicable).

TOTAL: 15 teams / 45 athletes

Individual Qualification

Only NOCs that have not accepted a team quota place are eligible to obtain individual quota places. Each athlete can obtain a maximum of one individual quota place for that athlete's NOC. For dressage, a nation can qualify for a maximum of one individual place (subject to Clause 2.3 of Section F1 (Reallocation of Unused Quota Places)).

FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage

The FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage (as defined in the Appendix) is limited to the best four results per athlete/horse combination in Olympic Ranking events, within the period from 1 January to 31 December 2027. The points system, including the list of events, to be used for establishing the FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage will be published by 15 December 2026 at the latest.

14 athletes

FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage (allocation through FEI Olympic Groups)

The two highest ranked athletes in the FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage from each of the five groups listed below will obtain one individual quota place each for their NOC:

A – North-Western Europe;

B – South-Western Europe

C – Central and Eastern Europe; Central Asia

F – Africa and Middle East

G – South-East Asia and Oceania

Allocation through FEI Olympic Group Qualification Event and FEI Olympic Ranking

The two highest ranked individual athletes from Olympic Groups D and/or E, with a maximum of one per NOC, from the overall individual classification at the 2027 Pan American Games will obtain one individual quota place each for their NOC.

The two highest ranked athletes from the FEI Olympic Ranking for Olympic Groups D and E combined, with a maximum of one per NOC, will obtain one individual quota place each for their NOC.

D – North America

E – Central and South America

1 athlete

FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage (allocation through overall ranking)

One individual quota place will be allocated in descending order of the highest ranked athletes in the FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage, excluding athletes who have already obtained a quota place for their NOC through the FEI Olympic Group Rankings.

TOTAL: 15 Athletes**D.2.****Host Country Places**

The host country will be allocated one team quota place with a maximum of three athletes. Each athlete and horse must fulfil the minimum age requirements and the MER to compete.

If the host country is unable to field a team, it may send one eligible individual athlete instead.

E. CONFIRMATION**E.1. Confirmation of quota places**

After each qualification event, the FEI will publish the results on its website (<https://inside.fei.org>). The team and individual quota places will be confirmed separately as detailed in paragraph **H. Qualification Timeline**.

By 12 January 2028, further to receipt of the NOC Certificate of Capability from the relevant NOCs by 10 January 2028, the FEI will inform the respective NOCs/NFs in writing of their allocated team quota places. Each NOC must confirm or decline the allocated team quota place by 20 January 2028.

After the NOCs'/NFs' confirmation of team participation and reallocation of withdrawn team quota places (if applicable), the FEI will inform the respective NOCs/NFs in writing of their allocated individual quota places on 1 February 2028, and each NOC with individuals must confirm the use of quota places by 8 February 2028, as detailed in paragraph **H. Qualification Timeline**.

E.2. Confirmation of Host Country Places

The host country must provide its NOC Certificate of Capability by 10 January 2028 and confirm in writing to the FEI the use of its host country places by 12 January 2028.

F. REALLOCATION

F.1. Reallocation of unused Quota Places

1. Unused team quota places (excluding host country places)

- 1.1 If an NOC does not confirm the NOC Certificate of Capability (as defined in the Appendix) by 10 January 2028 or informs the FEI, by 20 January 2028, that it is declining its team quota place, the team quota place(s) will be considered to be withdrawn and will be reallocated as follows:
- The team quota place(s) will be redistributed to the Composite Team(s) (as defined in paragraph 1.5 below and the Appendix), provided that the NOC(s) had the minimum three eligible combinations as of 31 December 2027. The NOC(s) of the Composite Team(s) will have a period of one week to confirm to the FEI that they accept the quota place. If the NOC does not confirm the quota place, paragraph 1.2 below applies.
 - If an NOC has declined a team quota place by 20 January 2028 or has not confirmed the NOC Certificate of Capability by 10 January 2028, the NOC will not automatically be entitled to be allocated an individual quota place but will remain eligible to obtain one individual quota place through the FEI Dressage Olympic Rankings as per the method set out in D.1 above.
- For the purpose of this process, the term “withdrawal” will mean either:
- (i) Written notification by an NOC to the FEI that the NOC is declining its team quota place, or
 - (ii) If an NOC does not confirm its NOC Certificate of Capability (as defined in the Appendix) by the 10 January 2028 deadline.
- 1.2 If an NOC withdraws its team quota place after 20 January 2028 or does not submit a valid FEI Certificate of Capability by 12 June 2028, the following will apply:
- (i) Where an NOC withdraws its team quota place after 20 January 2028 but on/before 11 June 2028:
 - (a) The team quota place(s) will be redistributed as a Composite Team(s) quota place to the NOC of the next highest ranked Composite Team not already qualified, provided that the NOC(s) had the minimum three eligible combinations as of 31 December 2027. That NOC will have a period of one week or until 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) to confirm to the FEI that it will accept the quota place. The NOC must submit the FEI Certificate of Capability to the FEI by 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028.
 - (b) If an NOC that is reallocated a quota place as per paragraph 1.2 (i) (a) above declines the quota place or does not confirm it by the applicable deadline (as set out above), the team quota place(s) will be further redistributed as a Composite Team(s) quota place to the NOC of the next highest ranked Composite Team not already qualified, provided that the NOC had the minimum three eligible combinations as of 31 December 2027. That NOC shall have a period of one week or until 12 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) to confirm to the FEI that it accepts the quota place. The NOC must submit the FEI Certificate of Capability to the FEI by 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028. If that NOC declines the quota place or does not confirm it by the applicable deadline (as set out above), no further reallocation to Composite Teams will take place, and paragraph 1.4 below will apply.
- 1.3 Where an NOC that has been (re)allocated a team quota place does not or cannot submit a valid FEI Certificate of Capability by 12 June 2028, paragraph 1.4 below will apply.
- 1.4 If the full quota of 15 teams has not been reached following the reallocation of team quota places as detailed above, the unused athlete quota places (three per team) will be reallocated to the NOCs as

individual quota places. These places will be allocated to the NOC of the next highest ranked athletes from the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage, excluding NOCs that have already accepted a team quota place and those that have already accepted an individual quota place, and provided that the NOC has at least one athlete/horse combination that fulfils the MER by the MER Deadline. The NOCs must each submit an FEI Certificate of Capability no later than one week after being informed of the allocation of the quota place or before 25 June 2028 (whichever is earlier), provided that all athlete/horse combinations on the FEI Certificate of Capability had achieved the MER by the MER Deadline of 11 June 2028.

- 1.5 Composite Team (see also the Appendix): A three-member team from an NOC. The Composite Team will be selected in accordance with the following process:
- (i) the respective ranking points of each NOC's top three different athletes in the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage will be added together to give the cumulative ranking points;
 - (ii) the NOC with the highest cumulative ranking points will be awarded the redistributed quota place;
 - (iii) in the event of a tie (i.e. where the cumulative ranking points are the same), the redistributed quota place will be awarded to the NOC with the highest ranked athlete in the overall FEI Olympic Ranking - Dressage. In the event of a further tie, the redistributed quota place will be awarded to the NOC with the second highest ranked athlete in the overall FEI Olympic Ranking - Dressage, and so on. If the tie cannot be broken by following this process, the FEI will invite the NOCs/NFs concerned to a draw.

2. Unused Individual quota places

- 2.1 If an allocated individual quota place is not confirmed by the NOC or is declined by the NOC by the confirmation deadline, 8 February 2028, or an NOC that has been allocated an individual quota place declines its individual quota place on/after 8 February 2028 but before 11 June, the quota place will be reallocated as follows:

- (i) If the unused individual quota place was earned through the 2027 Pan-American Games, the quota place will be reallocated to the NOC of the next highest placed athlete in the overall individual classification at the 2027 Pan-American Games, excluding NOCs already qualified. That NOC will have a period of one week or until 12 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) to confirm to the FEI that it will accept the quota place. The NOC must submit the FEI Certificate of Capability to the FEI by 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028.

If the NOC that is reallocated a quota place as per paragraph 2.1 (i) above declines the quota place or does not confirm it by the applicable deadline (as set out above), the quota place will be further redistributed through the overall FEI Olympic Rankings – Dressage. The relevant NOC will then have a period of one week or until 12 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) to confirm to the FEI that it will accept the quota place. The NOC must submit the FEI Certificate of Capability to the FEI by 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028.

- (ii) If the unused quota place was earned through the FEI Olympic Group Ranking – Dressage for the FEI Olympic Groups FEI Olympic Groups A, B, C, F, G, D and/or E (combined), the quota place will be reallocated to the NOC of the next highest ranked athlete in the relevant FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage from the relevant FEI Olympic Group(s) (with FEI Olympic Groups D and/or E considered as one combined group for this purpose). That NOC will then have one week or until 12 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) to confirm to the FEI that it will accept the quota place. The NOC must submit the FEI Certificate of Capability to the FEI by 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028.
 - (iii) If the quota place to be reallocated was originally allocated based on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage, the quota place will be reallocated to the NOC of the next highest ranked athlete in the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage. That NOC will then have a period of one week or until 12 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) to confirm to the FEI that it will accept the quota place. The NOC must submit the FEI Certificate of Capability to the FEI by 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028.
 - (iv) If the NOC that is reallocated a quota place as per paragraph 2.1 (ii) or (iii) above declines the quota place or does not confirm it by the applicable deadline (as set out above), the quota place will be further redistributed through the overall FEI Olympic Rankings – Dressage. The relevant NOC will then have a period of one week or until 12 June 2028 (whichever is earlier) to confirm to the FEI that it will accept the quota place. The NOC must submit the FEI Certificate of Capability to the FEI by 23:59 (Lausanne time) on 12 June 2028.
- 2.2 If there is/are any unused or unallocated individual quota place(s) after 12 June 2028, this/these will be reallocated to the NOC(s) of the next highest ranked athlete(s) from the overall FEI Olympic Ranking Dressage (that has/have not already been allocated a quota place), subject to the following conditions:
- (i) The relevant NOC(s) must have at least one athlete/horse combination that fulfilled the MER by the MER Deadline; and
 - (ii) The NOC(s) must submit a FEI Certificate of Capability no later than one week after being informed of the allocation of the quota place or before 25 June 2028 (whichever is earlier), provided that all athlete/horse combinations on the FEI Certificate of Capability had achieved the MER by the MER Deadline of 11 June 2028.
- 2.3 If the maximum quota of 60 athletes has not been reached following the reallocation of individual quota places as detailed above, any unused individual quota places will be reallocated to the NOC(s) of the next highest ranked athlete(s) on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking - Dressage, from an NOC that has already earned an individual quota place (maximum of two individual quota places per NOC) and subject to the NOC meeting the conditions set out in paragraph 2.2 (i) and (ii) above. Under no circumstances may the total number of athletes exceed 60.
- 2.4. No reallocations will be made by the FEI after the Sports Entries deadline has passed.

F.2. Reallocation of unused Host Country Places

If the Host Country is unable to field a team or decides to send one eligible athlete instead of a team, the unused athlete quota places will be reallocated to the NOCs of the highest ranked athletes (not already qualified) in the overall FEI Olympic Ranking–Dressage.

G. AP ALTERNATE ATHLETES

Definition:

Ap athletes are non-competing athletes accredited in the “Ap” category who have different entitlements to competing athletes (accredited as “Aa”) as described in the “Ap” accreditation quotas and conditions outlined in the IOC ACR Annex 1 - Accreditation at the Olympic Games. These alternate athletes are not part of the athlete quota as described in Paragraph **B. Quota Places**. “Ap” alternate athletes could become competing athletes only under the conditions outlined in the IOC/Los Angeles 2028 Late Athlete Replacement policy.

Only NOCs that have qualified a team are entitled to an Ap athlete (one athlete and one reserve horse per team) as described in the qualification system.

Eligibility:

“Ap” athletes and reserve horses must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes, as described in paragraph **C. Athlete Eligibility**.

APPENDIX – Definitions

Composite Team: A three-member team from an NOC. The Composite Team will be selected in accordance with the following process:

- the respective ranking points of each NOC's top three different athletes in the overall FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage will be added together to give the cumulative ranking points;
- the NOC with the highest cumulative ranking points will be awarded the redistributed quota place;
- in the event of a tie (i.e. when the cumulative ranking points are the same), the redistributed quota place will be awarded to the NOC with the highest ranked athlete on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking - Dressage. In the event of a further tie, the redistributed quota place will be awarded to the NOC with the second highest ranked athlete on the overall FEI Olympic Ranking - Dressage, and so on. If the tie cannot be broken by following this process, the FEI will invite the NOCs/NFs concerned to a draw.

FEI Certificate of Capability: A certificate that must be provided by the National Federation to the FEI for each athlete and horse nominated to participate in the Olympic Games. This certificate confirms the MER as laid down in the FEI Regulations for Equestrian Events at the Olympic Games. It confirms that the athletes and horses have the necessary experience and ability to participate at the required standard.

FEI Olympic Groups: means the Olympic Groups as set out in Appendix 2.

FEI Olympic Ranking – Dressage: The official rankings based on results achieved by an athlete and horse as a combination at the Olympic Ranking Events during the period from 1 January 2027 to 31 December 2027. The List of the Olympic Ranking Events and the relevant ranking rules will be published by 15 December 2026.

FEI Olympic Group Qualification Events: The events at which teams from specific FEI Olympic Groups can participate in order to earn a team quota place, namely:

- For FEI Olympic Groups A and B: the 2027 FEI Dressage European Championships;
- For FEI Olympic Group C: the 2027 Group C FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Event;
- For FEI Olympic Groups D and E: the 2027 Pan-American Games;
- For FEI Olympic Group F: the 2027 Group F FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Event (only if a team quota place cannot be allocated to an FEI Olympic Group F NOC at the FEI Dressage World Championships 2026) as per the process set out in Section D (Qualification Pathway));
- For FEI Olympic Group G: the 2027 Group G FEI Designated Olympic Qualification Event (only if a team quota place cannot be allocated to an FEI Olympic Group G NOC at the FEI Dressage World Championships 2026 as per the process set out in Section D (Qualification Pathway)).

MER Deadline: 11 June 2028.

MER Events: Those events at which Athletes and Horses can earn the minimum eligibility requirements.

NOC Certificate of Capability: NOC confirmation that at least three athlete/horse combinations from that NOC have achieved the MER during the FEI Dressage World Championships 2026 – 31 December 2027 period. Such confirmation must be provided to the FEI by 10 January 2028.

Olympic Ranking Events: The events at which points for the FEI Olympic Rankings – Dressage can be earned.
